

If you have below a 3.0 GPA, we'll also take test scores, community involvement, leadership and other experience into account. Either way, we ask you to submit test scores for advising, scholarship decisions and other purposes.



¹Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Program — WUE provides reduced tuition to students who are residents of one of the states participating in the WUE program (AK, AZ, CA, HI, ID, MT, NV, NM, ND, OR, SD, UT, WA, WY). Note: Students cannot qualify for in-state residency after attending UNC as a WUE student. One would need to decline WUE and pay nonresident tuition for one year before establishing in-state residency.

²This is what students pay after the College Opportunity Fund (COF) is applied to their bill, \$85 per RI credit. To be eligible for COF rates, Colorado resident students should apply at CollegeInColorado.org.
